Affected by the 'bedroom tax'?

Get off on the right foot and keep yourself in the black.

How do I know how much to pay?

The council has written to you, telling you how much extra you have to pay each week. If you are in arrears and have an agreement or court order, you need to add your arrears payment to the figure.

What if I want to pay monthly?

Remember that you need to pay in advance at the beginning of the month, not at the end.

If you pay a weekly amount towards any arrears, add this on to your weekly rent payment. Then use our easy formula.

£ weekly payment x 4.35 = £ monthly payment

Easy ways to pay rent - find the best way for you

You'll need an Allpay card to pay over the internet, by text or at PayPoint outlets. Please call us on **0113 200 7700** to order one.



- **Direct debit.** Weekly, fortnightly, monthly whatever suits you the best. It changes automatically when your rent changes, so it's the easiest method. Call us to set one up.
- **Standing order.** You're in control with this method, but you have to amend it every time your rent or benefit levels change.
- By phone: Call us to pay by debit or credit card.
- At our office: Pay with cash, cheque, debit card or credit card.
- Paypoint outlet: Use your Allpay card to pay by cash or card.
- Online: Use your Allpay card at www.allpay.net.
- Mobile text: Register on the Allpay website at https://www.allpayments.net/textpay

Unity Housing and Connect Housing recently ran an eight week long computer course, in partnership with Learn Direct.

The workshops were set up to help people to learn how to use IT to seek welfare advice, save money on bills and get easier access to local services. Attendees learnt how to use a computer, keyboard and mouse. They also practiced searching the Internet and sending emails.





These skills will are becoming increasingly important to our tenants. The course participants can now use their new knowledge to claim benefits online and find work with the Universal Jobsmatch service.

One participant, **Mr Moran, Moortown,** attended the course to help him keep in touch with his daughter. Another participant, **Ms Humphrey, Yeadon,** said:

"This has been a life-changing experience. It has given me confidence and opened up new horizons for me."






A Healthy Living Centre in Leeds



- They will be questioning the housing officer to find out what she's doing to make sure that residents look after their homes and gardens.
- They asked for a bit of extra attention in 2013 to get the estate looking better.

As well as our regular Tenant Panel meetings on the first Tuesday of every month, we're focussing on particular areas where tenants have asked for improvements or action.



Unity's Maintenance team is working with our Tenant Panel to set a new 5-year planned maintenance programme. This is our plan for which homes are getting new items, like kitchens or windows. We base our plan on how old items are, what condition they're in and how important they are to the people who live there.

We cannot promise that we will be able to replace the things you want, but we will take your opinions into account when deciding what work to do to your home. Please note, if your home is less than 10 years old it is unlikely that we will replace anything in the next 5 years, as older homes will be in greater need.

Showers

We know that some of our homes have showers, but a lot don't. Showers are quicker, more convenient and cheaper to run, so we want to make sure that all our homes have one by the end of our next 5-year plan.

If you have put in your own shower, we would like to offer to repair or replace it for free when it breaks down. Our Maintenance team will be more than happy to do this as long as it has been installed correctly, on the understanding that if it is uneconomical to repair, we will replace it with a Unity standard shower.

Moving on



With the new Welfare Reforms kicking in this April,, a lot of people are wondering how they can avoid the Housing Benefit reductions by moving into a smaller home. There is a range of options open to you if you need to move. Make sure that your home and your rent account are in order, to give yourself the best possible chance of moving.

Leeds Homes



Ask us for a Leeds Homes application pack to register for rehousing with all the main social landlords in Leeds. Once you have your membership number, you can bid for any property advertised in the weekly Leeds Homes magazine. You can find more information at **www.leedshomes.org.uk**. Once you have successfully registered, tell us that you want to downsize so that we can do our best to help you to move.

Find a mutual exchange with 'house exchange'



You can access this national home-swap scheme online at **www.leedshomes.houseexchange.org.uk**. Complete their simple online form to look for a mutual exchange partner in Leeds or anywhere else in the country. Once you've found someone to swap with, get in touch with Unity for the next step.

To access all the site's features for free, you need to choose 'Leeds Homes' as your landlord option. If you don't have internet access, our reception team will be happy to help you to register. Just call us to make an appointment.

To help Unity tenants who want to move to the right size home, we've introduced a scheme to help you to find your ideal home exchange.
