Unity and building contractor Keepmoat jointly sponsored the Easter weekend event the 'Fun Runsie' at the Hunslet Club. A number of people from the local community attended the event in which children participated in games dressed in 'onesies'.

Unity's sponsorship of the event and our involvement in South Leeds community life complements the wider regeneration of the areas

of Beeston and Holbeck. If you live in, or have visited South Leeds recently, you will have noticed that there is a great deal of construction work taking place.

Unity is playing a major role in this redevelopment, with our next major scheme on Brown Lane East due to be complete later this year. The scheme on Brown Lane East, Holbeck will feature a mix of 42 flats and houses, some of which will provide opportunities for first-time buyers in that they will be available for shared-ownership. UHA Shortlisted for National Award!



Unity Housing Association was shortlisted for the UK Housing Awards 2014. The awards, which recognise outstanding work by housing organisations to improve the lives of people in their communities, are organised by the Chartered Institute of Housing (CIH) and Inside Housing magazine.

Now in their 18th year, this year's awards attracted more than 250 entries from all over the UK. Unity Housing was one of six left in the running for the 'Small Social Landlord of the Year' Award.

Unity was nominated for the award owing to the success of its Employment Service which offers a bespoke service to individual tenants to help them access the training and qualifications they need to find work. The introduction of a dedicated Financial Inclusion Service also helped secure Unity's nomination. Unity's Financial Inclusion Officer provides advice and support relating to debt,

- Nadeen Strachan, an independent fashion designer and seamstress who, in the past, has made outfits that have appeared on TV.
- Carol Sorhaindo, a mixed media artist who takes inspiration from her African and Caribbean heritage and culture.
- SAZi, a business specialising in pottery and ceramics that also offer classes for those wishing to make their own items.
- Hannah Stained Glass, who makes bespoke stained glass windows for churches and chapels as well as smaller items including jewellery and homeware.
- Millbeck Studio, a company that makes clocks, candles and a number of other items by hand.
- Echo Home Leeds, who restore and recycle furniture and trade other collectables.



Improvement Works

Chapeltown Enterprise Centre and Unity Business Centre are undergoing a major refurbishment this year to improve the services that we are able to offer our business tenants.

Works will include re-cladding roofs, new doors and windows, new lifts, re-wiring, new signage and data cabling for faster broadband. The £1.4 million project is part-funded by the European Regional Development Fund, Leeds City Council and Unity.

The Employment Team are always on the look out for more people to help - if you could benefit from some free one-to-one support and advice contact them today!



- ✓ Use for any journey, any time, any day of the week, whether for interviews or pleasure
- A 28-day ticket for only £5

Stratford Court, Chapel Allerton



- The properties will be aimed specifically at the over 55s.
- The scheme will feature a mix of 1 and 2 bedroom self-contained apartments available for affordable rent and low-cost sale.

- 28 new homes will be created. This will be Unity's first development in the area of Chapel Allerton.
- Work has already commenced is expected to be completed by the end of 2014. The construction has provided jobs for 6 local people.

What is Universal Credit?

The Government intend to introduce Universal Credit. Universal Credit will replace:

- Income-based Jobseeker's Allowance
- ✓ Income-related Employment Support Allowance
- ✓ Income Support
- Working Tax Credit
- ✓ Child Tax Credit
- Housing Benefit

Claimants will need to submit an online application and then attend a face-to-face interview to find out if the claim has been successful and how much the claimant will receive.


Successful claimants will receive their first payment one month and seven days after their claim has been submitted.

Claimant Commitment

Claimants who are able to work but are not currently employed, will have to sign a 'Claimant Commitment' in order to continue to receive Universal Credit. This is an agreement that the claimant comes to with their 'work coach' and stipulates the tasks the claimant must complete in order to sustain a claim. It could include things like:

- What they need to do to look for work
- Mow many hours they should spend looking for work
- Their circumstances including your work history, health, family and caring responsibilities

Areas where claimants are already eligible for Universal Credit:



Personal Workplans

Claimants will also be required to adhere to a Personal Work Plan. This document includes:

- A plan of what they need to do to find work
- A record of their progress
- ✓ Proof that they've been looking for work

Benefits & Drawbacks

Benefits

Only one claim to submit.

People working part-time (especially those on 0-hour contracts) could benefit. Claimants can work as many hours as they like and not risk losing all their benefits at once.

Drawbacks

The claim must be made online, so access to a computer device and the Internet will be required. The form is not necessarily compatible with Smart Phone devices.

New claimants will wait more than one month before their first payment, meaning they could go for as long as one month with no income.

Claimants require a bank or building society account.

Payments will be made directly to the claimant and as such they will need to have more control over their income and outgoings.

Payments are monthly meaning that claimants will have to budget for an entire month whereas they may be used to budgeting weekly or fortnightly.

What can I do to prepare?

If you are worried about the introduction of Universal Credit there are a number of things you can do to prepare and make the transition as smooth as possible.

- If you don't already have one, you could open a basic bank or building society account.
- If you are unfamiliar with computers, you could book yourself a place on a free computer course. Unity will be happy to help you find a course that suits your needs.
- As Universal Credit is paid in arrears, when it is introduced you could go one month without receiving anything. If you can afford it, you could set aside a few pounds each month to prepare you for this time.

- As Universal Credit will be paid directly to you you will need to remember to pay your rent. If you pay your rent in cash, or make irregular payments using your card, you may wish to set up a standing order or direct debit instead.
- If you are not used to budgeting for a whole month, you could start practicing now. If you would like some help with saving and setting aside money or would like some free financial advice, call our Financial Inclusion Officer, Clive on 0113 200 7753.

What's Tenant Scrutiny?

Tenants who want to challenge and influence how Unity's services are influenced are encouraged to join our Tenant Scrutiny Panel.

Tenant scrutiny of services is a cornerstone of ensuring that Unity is properly run. Our Scrutiny Panel meets every three months to closely examine how Unity is performing. Because it is a more committed role that requires particular skills, tenants have to apply to join the Scrutiny Panel.

The role of the Scrutiny Panel is to:

- Scrutinise the services Unity provides, while promoting 'Value for Money'
- Ensure our policies and procedures meet the diverse needs of our tenants
- Enable our tenants to challenge our performance and plans
- Drive improvements from a tenants' perspective
- Make recommendations for service improvements
- Scrutinise the performance of individual contractors

Who can join the Scrutiny Panel?

The Tenant Scrutiny Panel is open to all tenants and shared-owners. As a minimum you will be expected to attend four meetings a year. You should also have:

- ☑ Good communicational skills
- ✓ Strong team working skills
- ✓ Ability to actively listen at meetings
- ☑ Ability to constructively challenge information

Getting online

There are 16 million people in the UK who lack basic IT skills. We can help if you're one of them.

The Internet has opened up a world of wonders for so many people - it is difficult for them to imagine life without it. Whether you would like to be able to search for and apply for jobs online, stay in touch with friends and family using email or compare fuel tariffs to make sure you are getting the best deal, it's worth getting online.

Did you know?

The Government intend to introduce Universal Credit to benefit claimants. This means that people claiming a range of benefits will no longer have separate claims for benefits but will have to submit a claim for a single monthly payment.

Universal Credit claimants will have to complete an online form. This means that if you need to make a claim you will need to access the Internet.

Am I on the waiting list?

A number of you have said that you'd like some help from Unity to get online. We are in the process of trying to get access to some more IT equipment so we can host bigger and better classes. If you have said you would like to attend a free computer class - you are on the waiting list - we have not forgotten about you!

Marketing & Communications Administrator Lewis will be in touch to let you know when the free computer classes are up and running again.

Upcoming courses

Although Unity will be happy to help any tenants who want to improve their computer skills - you may also wish to get help elsewhere. Citizens Online offers free computer courses to the general public which you may find just as useful.
